The **NATIONAL PRAYER BREAKFAST** in Parliament House, Canberra is on Monday, 16 October at 6:30AM. There is also a service on Sunday evening and a seminar after the breakfast. In 2015, Father Rob was the presenter for the seminar. This year, Rev'd Dr John Dickson is the presenter.

St John's and Warrior Welcome Home are again considering putting a table of eight together for this event. The cost is \$50 per head for the breakfast and \$50 per head for the seminar (the church service is free). The **GUILD OF CHURCH MUSICIANS** will hold its Annual Festival Service at St John's (which is the Guild church) on Sunday, 22 October, commencing at 3:00PM.

The service has been drawn up by Father Michael Deasey OAM, is entitled "The Joy of the Gospel" and, in the year of the 500th anniversary of the Reformation, features selected texts from both Martin Luther and Pope Francis. The 40th anniversary of establishment of the Uniting Church in Australia also will be acknowledged.

Guild Sub-warden Bishop Richard Hurford OAM KStJ will lead the service, which will commence with an academic procession. Service music is a mix of congregational hymns, choral anthems, instrumental ensemble and organ music. The 2017 combined choir comprises members of "The Mater Chorale" and the parish choirs of St Paul's Anglican Church, Burwood and St Stephen's Uniting Church, Macquarie Street, all directed by St Paul's Burwood Director of Music Sheryl Southwood. Four members of Consort 8 will provide meditative instrumental interludes and Dr Brett McKern, the Guild's Director of Studies, is the accompanist for the service and will provide the postlude.

Guild Chair Madeleine Rowles extends a very warm invitation to all St John's parishioners to come to the service and fellowship with Guild members and service participants over afternoon tea in the hall following the service.

The **BIBLE SOCIETY** is conducting a drive to **DELIVER BIBLES THROUGHOUT MONGOLIA**.

Their appeal letter introduces Bayarmagnai Bayardalai, known as Magnai, a missionary with the Mongolian Union Bible Society serving a church spread over a vast landscape fraught with extraordinary challenges. Distance and isolation are familiar to Australians, but Mongolia has an enormous expanse of lonely terrain. Outside of the capital, Ulaanbaatar, isolated communities are spread out over 21 provinces. Roads connecting these communities are usually muddy rutted dirt tracks, often barely visible due to dust storms, snow and ice.

Reaching a population that is one-third nomadic is a struggle. Outside of urban centres, following their ancient nomadic tradition, families pack up their ger (Mongolian for a yurt) and follow their livestock from one pastureland to another. Churches that meet in gers have to cope with serving a people on the move.

The Bible Society seeks funds to provide and operate a sturdy four wheel drive vehicle so Magnai and his team can deliver Bibles across Mongolia, helping to strengthen and grow the church on the Steppe. They aim to distribute 10,000 Bibles across the 21 provinces this year.

When communism made way for a democratic form of government in 1990, there were just a few known Christians in Mongolia. By 2000, the numbers of believers had increased to nearly 10,000 and by 2010 it reached 40,000. Now there are at least 50,000 believers meeting in around 600 churches around the country. The Bible Society reports these new Christians, 2% of Mongolia's population, but a growing number, are desperate for Bibles. Magnai says, "Our mission is to provide a Bible to every family."
